On handicap Yapp took first place with Woodcock second. In third place after a battle with Yapp came Mike and Jess Readhead in their Enterprise.

For the second race the top mark became a starboard one and this time Woodcock and Tyrrell enjoyed a close battle until Woodcock pulled away to finish in forty-five minutes with Tyrrell about four minutes behind. Yapp lost the battle this time with the Readheads but came in third overall and on handicap. The two leading boats tied for first position on handicap.
