That is how the first boats finished, Mackley in just over half an hour and Archer just under a minute behind. In the second race in an increasing wind and rising tide 6 boats ventured out in quite gusty conditions resulting in two retirements. This time Sam Woodcock took over the helm of Mayfly and had a convincing lead of 3 minutes over Mackley at the finish. Paul Armitage sailing B60 "Jane" crewed by Karen Armitage came in third 2 minutes later.

On handicap Woodcock kept his lead, Armitage moved up to take second and Mackley was again third.
